

The Northampton Patent is granted by the British Royal Crown on October 17, 1741, to Jacob Mase and several others

French and Indian War 1754 -1763

Sir Wil. Johnson moves from Amsterdam to Johnson Hall in Johnstown. Sir Will. Johnson builds "fish house" as his camp

Between 1762 and 1771, the Shews move to Fish House and Shew has a son Godfrey, March 9, 1771

Sir William Johnson dies on July 11, 1774, at his home during an Indian conference

Declaration of Independence July 4, 1776

The British raid on June 2, 1778, taking Godfrey Shew and his sons. Sir William Johnson's "fish house" was burned during the raid by orders of Sir Wil. Johnson's son John

Godfrey Shew and his sons return to Fish House, 1779

Godfrey Shew builds his second home after released from capture, 1784

Revolutionary War ends

Samuel Olmstead becomes first settler in the Village of Northville

George Washington becomes President

The Town of Northampton was established February 1st. The first school is established.

John Fay builds the largest house in Fish House, later known as the Fish House Hotel

The first brick building was built in Fish House by John Fay as a store

David Marvin from Conn. builds on the site of Sir Wil. Johnson's "fish house"

Construction begins on Erie Canal in New York

The Fish House covered bridge is built by Daniel Stewart

The plank road is built from Amsterdam to Fish House.

John Paterson builds a 253- foot- long covered bridge across the Sacandaga

New York was first in lumber production, surpassing agriculture

Lincoln issues Emancipation Proclamation, freeing slaves; two years later, he is assassinated.


Union Pacific RR meets Central Pacific RR

The population of Northville grows to 800







Resseguie and Newton cleared the land for what will be the FJ &G rail tracks

Thomas Edison invents the improved incandescent light bulb

The FJ&G Railroad Company buys the 16 miles of track to Sacandaga Park

The FJ&G Railroad Company develops a camp and recreational area near the Northville RR Station

The railroad becomes aware that Sacandaga Park is growing in popularity so it builds the Adirondack Inn

Knitting factory opens on Division & 2nd Street. Village gets water system

Northville Fire Department formed

Northville is electrified

July 25 the Northville Bank opens its doors

First telephone service in Northville

A fire destroys 111 cottages in Sacandaga Park on May 8

The automobile arrives in Northville, and families can travel as they please

Sacandaga Park has 90,000 visitors

Spring runoff causes a disastrous flood from Northville to Albany

World War I, 1914 - 1918

President Harding is an overnight guest at Heeswijk; Women are given the right to vote and alcohol is prohibited. The logging industry ends in Northampton

The first construction contract is let to start the preparation of the reservoir, and Lindbergh crosses the Atlantic nonstop

The railroad receives \$1,727,696 settlement, and the stock market crashes on Wall Street

The Conklingville Dam is dedicated and the water rises to create the reservoir

Franklin D. Roosevelt becomes president

The cottages of Osborn Road burned

The High Rock Lodge burns down



The Rustic Theater burns down

Grand Union chain grocery store opens in the Village of Northville


Gov. Nelson Rockefeller signs into law a bill that renames the reservoir the Great Sacandaga Lake



Sacandaga Park's: Idle Hour Park




