The Gifford's originally were from England. The first Gifford's arrived in Sandwich, Mass. some time between 1643 and 1647. They were well educated people who became involved in their new country. Moses F Gifford's line migrated from Mass. to Ulster County, NY, then to Pittston, NY and finally to Town of Northampton, NY where many families from this Gifford line settled here and became farmers, lumbermen, merchants, school teachers, athletes, and in many other pursuits.
