## Juanita Chapter #246 of the Eastern Star, Northville, NY

(Date unknown)

This chapter was instituted on March 14, 1902. The name Juanita was adopted because it was favored by the first matron, Celia Zweifell. Each chapter came up with Indian names, it was assumed that Juanita was of that nationality but rightfully it is a Spanish name. Their first meeting place was upstairs over the Brown Pharmacy. (where the Chinese Restaurant is today) The stated purpose of the Order of Eastern Star (OES) is to provide a fellowship of men and women of high moral and social character who desire to provide charity, truth, and loving kindness to all mankind throughout the world.

The village of Northville is placing Historical Markers on Historic homes in Northville . It hasn't been determined yet how many will be placed each year. Bill and Barbara Mosher's House was designated as a historical house, July 2, 2011. (601 Bridge Street)

Mayor Jim Groff presented Bill with a plaque stating the year it was built (1888). The house first belonged to Nelson Robinson who worked for the FJ & G RR as a conductor and also a station agent. His son Dr. Collie Robinson later owned it and had his doctor's office there.



## Saturday July 16th

Over 180 visitors signed the guest book. It was determined that at least 1/4 of the people didn't sign, so there had to have been well over 200 visitors that day.
