Supervisor Groff opened for Public Comment at 7:06 p.m.

John Johnson explained that he is a resident on McKinley Ave. in the Sacandaga Park. He spoke regarding the speed bumps that he had requested in the past on McKinley Ave. He is requesting another speed bump where the biggest consolidation of children in the Sacandaga Park, from the middle speed

bump to the corner, it's approximately 216' 72 yards. We are having on going issues with patrons from the local bars/restaurants. From the corner these cars and motorcycles reach speeds from 50 MPH to 70 MPH. Our issue is from the corner of Vic's to the first speed bump these people are able to reach speeds up to 70 MPH, they slow down to go over the speed bump and then speed to the next speed bump. When he contacted Supervisor Groff, he (Johnson) was told that the speed bumps were not legal. I checked with Albany and it is because they are not permanent. There are speed bumps all over this country and if we have to make the speed bumps permanent, we understand that stated Mr. Johnson. We understand these speed bumps are removed before winter because of the plows.

If money is a concern, I will pay for it myself or the Park Association will pay for it stated Mr. Johnson. I am speaking for most of the people in the Sacandaga Park. The resolution to this problem when I spoke with Ken Cramer was to place the speed bumps in different locations on the road this year, which is not acceptable to me stated Mr. Johnson.

I (Johnson) was in charge of a Little League at one time and was told that neither the Town Board or the Town is responsible if there is a death or an injury. Sooner or later, it is going to happen. We have seen so many near misses stated Mr. Johnson. Now that you have been made aware of this issue and it is not addressed you responsible as both personally and as a township stated Mr. Johnson. That is, if something happens. I (Johnson) am not coming here as being challenging or condescending. If another speed bump is put in it 72' from the middle speed bump addresses the issue. It covers everybody and it protects you and the Town and it is no money. It shouldn't be an issue. If the idea of them not being permanent is illegal you are putting them there stated Mr. Johnson. I had issues where there are two speed bumps also, I don't think that their street is as long as ours (McKinley) and I don't think they have the amount of traffic as we do. I know Senator, Jim Tedisco and this issue will be resolved stated Mr. Johnson. I (Johnson) am not asking you; I am not threatening and I am not challenging you. It is a simple issue and it covers everyone one is this room. When the Park is at full capacity there are a lot of little kids and teenagers and more people in the park and they park on both sides of the road. When the place is at full capacity there are cars parked all up and down on both sides of the street. The kids dash out on bicycles, scooters, and now golf carts. I hope this can be resolved before Memorial Day and consider a third speed bump from the middle of the street half way to the other end of the street.

They technically are not legal as you were told stated Supervisor Groff. To say that there is no expense, there is an expense. We either have to repave the road and build speed bumps or a speed dip, Mr. Cramer noted that after Mr. Johnson talked with me last year I believe I did the research on it and told you it was between \$5,000 and \$9,000 a piece for each permanent speed bump.

My neighbors say this has been going on for 10 years and this doesn't have to be permanent stated Mr. Johnson.

But it does have to be permanent stated Supervisor Groff.

Councilman Simmons suggested that maybe we can talk with the State Police and the Sheriff's Department.

It was suggested maybe making that a one-way street.

Mr. Cramer mentioned that wouldn't work well when you have to plow the road.

Discussion ensued.

Youth/Rec: **BEACH:** A Town of Northampton/Village of Northville Joint Youth Commission meeting was held on Wednesday, May 12, 2021 regarding COVID-19 guidelines pertaining to the 2021 along with restrictions/regulations for opening the beach stated Councilman Gritsavage.

The Joint Youth Commission has scheduled a Special meeting for Thursday, May 20, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. to go over the information gathered to make a decision whether to open the beach this year or not. We have advertised for Gate people. We do have applications for that position. My feeling is that we might not because of the restrictions with the COVID. Councilman Gritsavage stated that he thinks it is going to be too difficult for us and it was a question of it being too costly to open the beach also. The other question was whether to have the gate open or not explained Councilwoman Zullo. It was going to be approximately \$12,000 over budget of what it would normally cost.

Last night the Village Board voted to open the gate stated Supervisor Groff. Councilman Gritsavage asked who is going to take care of the beach.

Mr. Matthews stated that as far as who was going to maintain it, it did come up last night and they voiced their concern as well. The summer street crew would go over and maintain it like they would any park during the week. First thing in the morning they would take care of the garbage and clean it up. There would obviously no port-a-johns over there because the beach would be closed, no trespassing signs would have to be up, no lifeguard on duty and such. The Village board did say contingent on the Youth Commissions decision on the beach closed, the Village Board would like to see the gate left open. They did say that the police officer does check out the information booth on State Hwy 30 nightly. So the beach would also be one of the areas that would be inspected so that there is no camping.

It was asked, who would do the inspection?

Mr. Matthews responded the Northville Police.

I see them working during the day but I don't see them working many nights stated the Supervisor.

Mr. Matthews stated that he did not know their schedule but did know that was mentioned that the police will check the beach.

Councilman Simmons mentioned that the Village Police are on duty in the Village unless called on an emergency, unless called to assist another agency, unless he is investigation something that happened in the Village.

Mr. Matthews stated that the Village and Town are joint permit holders of the beach and therefore it is the Village and Towns responsibility for the beach. The Village also has the responsibility of the Information Booth that was turned over to the Village a few years ago mentioned Mr. Matthews. The Merchants abandoned it and the Village now takes care of that.

It was asked if the insurance company knew if the gate was going to be left open. Mr. Matthews responded, yes. It changes the exposure to a waterfront exposure versus a beach operation exposure and we would be covered under general liability. It was advised to get this in writing.

The beach was closed and the gate was closed last year explained Councilman Gritsavage.

If the summer program is not happening this year who is responsible for the beach inquired

Councilwoman Zullo? The Commission is the one who is operating the beach stated Supervisor Groff.

SUPERVISOR: Supervisor Groff mentioned that he was invited and attended the presentation of the Fulton County Purple Heart Sign which was held on Monday, May 10, 2021 at 12 noon, on West Main St., Johnstown at the Sir William Memorial Park, in front of the Charles Jenner Memorial.

Marijuana Legalization: On March 31, 2021, Governor Cuomo signed into law Chapter 92 of the Laws of 2021 known as “the Marijuana Regulation and Taxation Act” (MRTA): The Legalization of Adult-Use Cannabis in New York. Councilwoman Molly Zullo was not for it. We do have to set a meeting for a Public Hearing to Opt out subject to a Permissive Referendum on or before December 31,2021 Opting out are only for areas outside of the Village. Attorney Albanese stated that he will draw up the Local Law.

NEW BUSINESS: Resident Joe Capobianco approached the town on wanting to have trees removed along the fence line that borders the Town of Northampton Ambulance building and the rear of Mr. Capobianco's property. Do we have a survey to know whether the trees are on the town property for Mr. Capobianco's property? No, but the trees appear to be on the side of the fence stated Councilman Simmons. But as long as we agree with him that they should come down then it shouldn't be a problem stated Attorney Albanese. We don't know who put the fence up there, it was so long ago stated the Supervisor. Councilman Gritsavage asked if it is that the Town or Villages responsibility? That is Town property stated Supervisor Groff. Mr. Capobianco wants to work with the Town and we need to get prices and see how many trees do we want to take down.

New Village of Northville, Town of Northampton Logo signage

Supervisor Groff mentioned that the Village of Northville Mayor and Board of Trustees at their meeting held last night announced that they will be redoing the signage at the entrance before the Northville Bridge coming into the Village of Northville from State Highway 30. Councilman Simmons stated that he didn't have a problem with the Town getting our own sign or going in with the Village. He has a problem with this Village Logo. Councilman Simmons mentioned that Linda before she passed away had a problem with the picture which shows the 5¢-10¢ building and part of the buildings south of it are on the signage. I have had a couple of business people say, why do they have that promoting a certain business on their logo and I don't believe it belongs there.

Councilman William Gritsavage stated that the 5¢-10¢ building is a historic building and it is a part of our history and it means a lot to this Village. Councilman Simmons stated that he agreed with Councilman Gritsavage I don't think it belongs there on the signage.

It was mentioned stated Supervisor Groff that the signage for all the local churches among all the other organizations will be moved to a different spot.

I believe they were looking at possibly putting them by the Information Booth on State Highway 30 stated Nathaniel Matthews. No one was sure who drew the picture, possibly a student. Nathaniel Matthews mentioned that the Village Board approved last night was that the new sign is going to be carved out with gold leaf. It was asked of the Town Board if they would like to do something different for signage by Supervisor Groff.

The Village of Northville is asking the Town of Northampton for their approval of the New Logo for signage to be placed at that site on the property by State Highway 30 and Bridge Street.

Information Booth

There was discussion regarding the Information Booth had been turned over to the Village years ago by the Merchants and that it was for any information to be made available for the public from both the Town

of Northampton and Village of Northville. It was so noted that the Town Board members present stated that they were unaware of this transaction that took place. Ken Cramer, Highway Superintendent wants know who owns the land around that building and who should be keeping the grounds mowed and plowed because he has been doing this for years. He was under the understanding that the Town owned the building and people needed access to the building and he had to maintain it. The response was that was State property.

It was mentioned by Councilman Simmons that years ago the Northville Merchant Association asked for donations to have the Information Booth built and the building was basically built by Bob Ellsworth over 20 years ago. It was agreed at that time that the businesses that put information in the building had to be from either from the Village or the Town. Everything went through the DOT in Utica stated Councilman Simmons.

OLD BUSINESS: Time Warner-Spectrum. The Attorney found correspondence dated Susan Eckhart and Elaine from 2015 and a memo from Kathy Radner in 2014 to Supervisor Groff. The Attorney spoke with Kevin Eagan at Time Warner-Spectrum. Attorney Albanese stated that eventually it may come down to that he (Albanese) and Kevin Eagan feel that these issues are still open and the Town Board may have to decide where you want to go to from there. Is there something in there about the length of the contract asked Councilman Simmons? Yes, and they said that a 5-year contract is not acceptable stated Attorney Albanese. There was a section that talks about the Attorney's fee and it says we will not accept to pay the Attorney's fees stated Attorney Albanese.
